The purpose of the rule is to safeguard against possible child abuse or wrongful accusations of child abuse. **If you cannot have "two-deep" leadership at a den meeting, please postpone the meeting!** Again, involvement in den activities by all parents (not necessarily all at the same meeting), can lead to a greater variety of activities, more fun, and more productive meetings.
